mentor letter

Thank you for expressing interest to be a Youth Mentor in the **mates** Mentoring Program which matches community volunteers with young people to serve as one-to-one Mentors. The Mentor role is that of a friend, positive role model and guide. As a Mentor you will meet with your Mentee once a fortnight for a year and take personal interest in their growth and development.

MATES - In-school Mentoring

Primary school children – Mentors meet with their Mentee on school grounds and during school hours. *Secondary school young people* – Mentors meet with their Mentee on school grounds and during school hours. After three months, or at the school's discretion, the opportunity to catch up out of school will be offered but only when a new permission form has been signed and agreed to by the Mentor, Mentee and the Parents/Guardians.

MATES - Connecting the Service Puzzle

If your mentee is in school, the above conditions continue to apply. However, you may be matched with a young person who is not in-school. Alternative venues have been identified and will be made available for mentor meetings for the first 3 months or until you are comfortable with meeting off-site.

mentor job description

A **mates** Mentor is a positive role model in a young person's life. The Mentor takes the lead in developing a respectful and supportive relationship with their Mentee. The one-to-one relationship is an opportunity for both people to grow and learn new things about themselves and each other. The benefits for the Mentor include personal fulfilment through contribution to the community and the Mentee, satisfaction in helping someone mature, progress, and achieve goals, enjoyment of group events and recognition events and self-improvement through training sessions.

As a **mates** Mentor you will aim to:

- ✓ Assist and extend the positive life experiences of your Mentee
- ✓ Target their life and educational goals
- ✓ Engage them more fully into their school and community and
- ✓ Identify the skills of young people

A **mates** Mentor is a person who:

- \checkmark is non-judgemental and open-minded
- \checkmark sets goals and is willing to help young people develop and achieve their own
- ✓ has respect for young people
- ✓ has an encouraging attitude towards young people's skills and interests
- ✓ has good communication skills
- ✓ has confidence in their own abilities
- ✓ is a good listener
- ✓ is trustworthy, patient, supportive, tolerant and flexible
- ✓ is willing to share personal experiences where appropriate to help in their Mentee's development
- ✓ is FUN!

Eligibility Requirements:

- ✓ 18 years of age or older
- ✓ Passed Working with Children Check and National Police Check
- ✓ Signed and Willing to adhere to Code of Conduct
- ✓ Willing to adhere to all School and **mates** Program Policies and Procedures
- ✓ Commits to the **mates** program for one year
- ✓ Commits to spend a minimum of one hour per fortnight 1:1 with Mentee
- ✓ Completes **mates** Mentor Application including details of two personal referees
- ✓ Agrees to attend required Mentor Training sessions
- ✓ Completes Mentor interview with Program Coordinator
- ✓ Willing to communicate regularly with Program Coordinator and submit monthly meeting and activity information where required.

Our Mission

What exactly is mates?

mates is a Youth Mentoring Program which was originally designed as a model which is easy and effective for all schools to implement at very little cost. **mates** continues to match students (Mentees) in school with a volunteer (Mentor) from the local community. **mates** has expanded to support the Connecting the Service Puzzle youth crime diversion initiative and provides MATES Mentors for young people who are consider at-risk and vulnerable. In a changing world schools can't do it alone. Communities have to work together to help support and nourish the variety of needs and capabilities of our young people.

What are the aims of mates?

 \underline{m} entor – to provide an additional positive role model in the lives of young people

<u>a</u>ssist – to assist and extend the positive life experiences of young people

target – to specifically target life and educational goals of young people

<u>engage</u> – to engage young people more fully into their schools and local communities

<u>s</u>kills – to identify and enhance the skills of young people

Who can get involved?

mates draws on the strong support of the local community to be positive role models (Mentors) for young people (Mentees). Mentors must be over 18 years old and meet Eligibility Criteria including getting a current Working with Children Check and Police Check if they don't already have one. Mentees must also meet Eligibility Criteria and are usually referred into the program by teachers, case workers, and support units. There is a screening process which means the Mentees are matched up with the best suited Mentor.

What is the time commitment?

To become involved in the program Mentors and Mentees have to commit to one year and meet a minimum of one hour per fortnight.
