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Following a passion – Vocational Education and Training

The 2017 school year has begun with Rainbow P-12 College VCAL student, Lauren McDonald, back for her second year of VET Hospitality. How great is it to see a young person with so much passion and flair for an industry? Last year Lauren competed her first year of VET Hospitality at the Wimmera Trade Training Centre and has her sights set on her future. She wants to complete her Year 12 Victorian Certificate of Applied Learning (VCAL) and become a chef and travel the world.

"I want to complete my Cert III and IV in commercial cookery and then I'd love to travel overseas, head out to the big wide world and learn different skills." Lauren is learning hospitality skills such as safety, waitressing, communication, barista and simple meal preparation and cooking.

"We open for lunch services on Wednesday during school term starting in term 2. The public can book a table

and have a full experience of what we learn as part of the hospitality course. We offer a two-course lunch menu with tea and coffee. We can seat up to 40 guests per session. It's always a full-on day when the restaurant is open. I enjoy cooking the best."

Lauren says "I can't draw or paint but my creative flare comes out in cooking and presentation of food".

Lauren is living and studying in Rainbow and travels by bus to Horsham, as do other students from right around the region, to participate in a more hands-on element of her schooling. "It's hard being from a rural area to gain employment. I'll probably have to move to Horsham when I finish school. I really want an apprenticeship."

The Hospitality course is delivered by Horsham College and is open to students from across the region. The kitchen at the Wimmera Trade Training Centre is well set up with all the latest equipment. Students can learn and experience all the different elements of the hospitality industry. Community members are encouraged to come and support the students and book in for a lunch service when the restaurant opens in Term 2. 

A community educator is available to visit schools in the Wimmera Southern Mallee region to conduct information sessions for teachers, parents and students.



A voyage in the Young Endeavour is an exciting experience and a unique opportunity for youth to develop skills for life. Internationally recognised development program builds self-awareness, develops teamwork and leadership skills and fosters a strong sense of community responsibility. 24 youth from across Australia will join each eleven-day voyage during the 2017 program. As members of the crew they will keep watch and take the helm, handle lines on deck, cook in the galley, navigate using the ships charts and climb the 30-metre mast to set and furl the sails.
