Vocational Education and Training for Senior Secondary Students is a great way for young people to get nationally recognised qualifications. Over 340 students attended the 2017 Try VET Day in early August allowing them to sample two of their course preferences for 2018.

Students from 14 Wimmera and Southern Mallee schools, stretching from Edenhope to Birchip were treated to a free BBQ lunch provided by the Wimmera Southern Mallee LLEN. A big shout out to SVCAL student Jake Hamerston who helped cook and serve 640 sausages for the hungry hordes in his rather fitting Bunnings jumper.



The day provided hands-on activities and a snapshot of courses and career pathways. Nineteen courses were on offer at Horsham College, Federation University, Longerenong College, Skillinvest and Centre for Participation, ranging from Engineering to Health Services. VET Cluster Coordinator Melissa Powell commented, "The students had a fantastic day. It was all very hands-on which really appealed to them. There were some very excited faces at the end of the day, who were keen to sign up for their VET Course for next year."

World Skills at Federation University








Are you a Year 12 student? School Leaver Employment Support (SLES) is a new NDIS support.

The annual closing date for applications is 30 September. Successful applicants will be notified by mail by 31 December and unsuccessful applicants by 31 January.

Where an applicant received a grant in the previous annual distribution, but has not provided a final report within 12 months of its receipt of that grant, payment of a new grant will be postponed until the Final Report on the previous grant has been received.

The majority of grants are for between \$5,000 and \$10,000.
