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## Horsham Primary School, Garden Award







Students from Horsham Primary School Rasmussen Campus have won a Victorian School Garden Award! Stevie and her father, Simon Clark, represented the school to receive the award at presentations held at the Melbourne Botanical Gardens on 15 November. The gardening project at Rasmussen Campus grew out of an initiative to provide lunch-time activities in sustainability and the STEM learning areas which resulted in winning the award for 'Most Engaging Garden for Learning'. The school was supported by Bunnings, Wimmera Southern Mallee LLEN and Wimmera Catchment Management Authority to develop a sustainable garden which incorporated many food plants which were of cultural significance to the Wotjobaluk, Jaadwa, Jadawadjali, Wergaia, and Jupagulk people.

## **Preschool Programs**

A number of primary schools across our region have established preschool programs to support parents of preschool children and provide activity-based sessions to enhance learning.

Schools recognise the importance of the preschool years in developing vital language and social skills and preschool sessions are designed with this in mind. At these sessions, parents gain skills that they can use to support their preschoolers in preparation for school. Stories, songs and engaging with children in conversation all contribute to a child's language and social development.

An additional advantage of preschool programs in schools is that parents and children become familiar with the school environment. Parents have the opportunity to meet school staff and to become a part of the school community while, for the children, school becomes a familiar place, making the transition to school much easier.

As a part of the Let's Read initiative, Wimmera Southern Mallee LLEN has supported schools in our region with the establishment of preschool programs in Goroke, Hopetoun, Nhill, Rainbow and Warracknabeal. The aim of the Let's Read program is to support language development in the preschool years and to ultimately improve learning outcomes for young people.

The Let's Read program emphasises the importance of reading to children from a young age and provides children's books for families across the region when they visit Maternal and Child Health Centres for their 4 month, 12 month, 18 month and 3½ year visits. To date, over 6,600 books have been distributed to families across the Wimmera Southern Mallee region to encourage parents to read with their children.

## **LLEN VET Awards**

Wimmera Southern Mallee LLEN has again sponsored awards for students undertaking Vocational Education and Training (VET) as part of their secondary school studies. The WSM VET Cluster offered 13 courses in 2018 with 269 students from across the Wimmera Southern Mallee region enrolling in these courses. Recipients of the LLEN VET Awards are chosen by the trainer in each course. Awards will be presented at each student's school awards night.

#### **Book Drive**

Ss Michael and John's Catholic School has conducted a book drive to collect and recycle pre-loved children's picture books. This initiative is to support the Wimmera Southern Mallee LLEN's Let's Read Program.

Let's Read programs across the Wimmera continue to provide books for young families by placing pop-up libraries in public places throughout the community in waiting rooms, playgroups, child-care facilities and places where families with young children gather. Tubs of pre-loved books are made available in these places to encourage parents to read with their children. A total 115 libraries have now 'popped up' across our region with 31 in Hindmarsh Shire, 21 in Horsham Rural City, 16 in West Wimmera Shire and 47 in Yarriambiack Shire. Anyone who would like to donate children's picture story books,



suitable for pre-school and early primary aged children, can donate books at Ss Michael and John's Catholic School or at the Wimmera Southern Mallee LLEN Office.

In this waste-conscious age, this is a great opportunity to recycle your pre-loved books to support the next generation of young readers.

## Support for Single Teenage Mothers in Your Schools and for Single-Mother Parents of Students in Your Schools

Many single mothers are unaware that they can obtain support, make local connections and receive free help through the Council for Single Mothers and their Children (CSMC). This support means they will be better equipped to help their children maximise their opportunities at school. The January/February time period is the busiest time of the year for CSMC as they help mums with financial support and other advice to help them get their children ready for school. Teen mums doing it on their own could also really use a friendly network of women who have gone before them and are ready to help.

### **Phone Call Practice for School Students**

So many of our SWL employers, teachers and students are telling us that more young people are avoiding talking over the telephone. They lack the experience and confidence to make a voice call to enquire about a placement, a job or talk to a stranger generally. Despite modern technology facilitating text messaging and online communication platforms, most employers still require people to pick up the phone and speak!

In response to this need the City LLEN has created a new initiative, Phone Call Practice for School Students. Every Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon between 2 and 4.30pm *students from anywhere in Victoria can ring us* with a pre-prepared opening line (refer to the flyer for distributing to students) and we will guide them through a conversation similar to that with an employer or if they prefer we can answer questions about courses, careers and pathways.
