#### **Conveyancing Allowance for VET Students**

#### Off campus study for students in Years 11 and 12

An allowance is available to Year 11 and 12 students enrolled at a Victorian Government or Non-Government school, who are required to travel 4.8km or more to a TAFE institute, Registered Training Organisation (RTO) or alternate school to access part of their course of study. Rates are calculated according to the number of days attended away from their main campus. The daily rate is \$2.10

Reading just ten minutes a day can instill a lifelong love of books and learning in young children. Research shows that children who are read to every day from an early age have extended vocabularies, increased reading readiness and improved cognitive skills when they enter school. The 1000 books before school program aims to encourage parents to read 1000 books with their children from birth until they begin school. #### **Epilepsy Foundation – new website for schools**

The Epilepsy Foundation just launched a new schools website <u>www.epilepsysmartschools.org.au</u> to help teachers, families and students understand and support students living with epilepsy. It has some great resources in it for teachers. **Some epilepsy facts:** 

- 1 in 200 children live with epilepsy.
- 1% of people in Australia are currently living with epilepsy.
- **1** in **4** people with a disability are likely to live with epilepsy, this is significantly higher than the general population.
- **10%** of Australians will have a seizure during their lifetime, while 3–4% will be diagnosed with epilepsy.
- Epilepsy occurs in both males and females.
- Epilepsy can occur at any age, but is more common in children and those over 60 years of age.
- Epilepsy responds to medication in approximately **70%** of people.

People with epilepsy have a mortality rate **2–3** times that of the general population. Epilepsy is ranked in the top five causes of avoidable death in the **5–29** age group.

Most teachers will therefore come into contact with a student living with epilepsy at some time in their career.

# What is ReConnect?

ReConnect: *Engagement learning and support* is a Victorian Government Initiative supporting young people who have left school early or who are long-term unemployed prepare for training and work.

Young people who leave school early often face multiple barriers to re-engaging in education and training and transitioning to the workforce or further training. ReConnect provides an individualised wrap-around service to each eligible participant to help them get back on track, build the resilience and capacity necessary to successfully transition into formal learning and employment and support to sustain this engagement with learning and work.

# Am I eligible?

ReConnect is a youth focused program aimed at 15 to 24 year olds living in the areas of Ballarat, Hepburn, Moorabool, Horsham, Central Goldfields, Ararat, Northern Grampians and Pyrenees who are:

15 to 24 year old	20 to 24 year old	
→ Did not complete Year 12 or equivalent	→ Year 12 Graduates	
→ Not currently studying	Unemployed for more than 12 months	
$\rightarrow$ Not in full-time employment	→ Under-employed (part-time/casual) for more than 12 months	

# How will ReConnect help me?

We will work with you to identify your individual needs and help you achieve your goals. This could be working on the barriers preventing you from enrolling or succeeding in formal training or employment. It may be to support you to complete an accredited course and use work placements to increase your employability, whatever your situation we're focused on helping young people transition to further training or employment.

We have broken it down into three simple steps:

- Get help to know where to start
- Get support someone to help you and guide you all the way so you aren't doing it alone
- Get training having recognised skills will help you to get a job and get paid


