## **Structured Workplace Learning and School Based Apprenticeships**

Here is a great way for businesses to try out potential new employees at very low cost (from just \$5 per day). Insurance is covered and you don't have to take out tax. Your business or organisation can provide an enormous amount of support for students in our region by providing work placements in the form of Structured Workplace Learning (SWL) and School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships (SBATs). It is a great way to see if the young person is a good fit for your business. SWL and SBAT placements are now listed on the new SWL portal. Students seeking a work placement in a particular industry can now access the information on the portal to find a suitable work placement.

WSMLLEN staff are available to support businesses to list work placement opportunities on the portal and are actively contacting businesses to source work placements. Listing placements on the portal will reduce the number of students making direct contact with local businesses to seek placements. Students apply via the portal to secure an interview. If the applicant is unsuccessful, the position is relisted.


This is a great innovation which streamlines the process for businesses and students.

## **Conveyancing Allowance for VET Students**

# Off campus study for students in Years 11 and 12

An allowance is available to Year 11 and 12 students enrolled at a Victorian Government or Non-Government school, who are required to travel 4.8km or more to a TAFE institute, Registered Training Organisation (RTO) or alternate school to access part of their course of study. Rates are calculated according to the number of days attended away from their main campus. The daily rate is \$2.10

# How well are we future-proofing students?



Reports have shown that within 10-15 years, nearly 40% of Australian jobs will be automated. This has prompted the Federal Government, schools and private industries to collaborate in a push to improve students' Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) education and ensure they're ready for the jobs of the future. Nicholas Wyman, CEO of Skilling Australia Foundation (SAF), told The Educator that the world was rapidly changing and this alone called for a new approach as to how schools motivate and link students with promising career opportunities.
